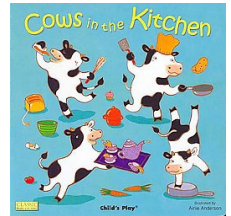

Cows in the Kitchen by Child's Play



Cow's in the Kitchen is a fun book to sing! This book can be sung to the tune of Skip to My Lou. This book is great for developing *phonological awareness*, the ability to hear and play with the smaller sounds in words.

Hearing and learning animal sounds help children hear different kinds of sounds. Having your child hear and make the sounds of animals is one enjoyable way to help develop phonological awareness.

Singing also helps develop phonological awareness, as singing naturally breaks words into smaller sounds or syllables. Once your child gets the rhythm of the book have them clap their hands three times when they hear the animal sounds. The movement helps your child feel the rhythm and enjoy the words in the song. Clapping also helps build your child's motor control.

Extend the Book

- ❖ Have your child help you read the story. Ask her what animal is on the pages and then what noise the animal makes.
- ❖ Count the number of animals on each page.
- ❖ Ask your child what the animals are doing. Ask them why they might be doing that.
- ❖ Point out the pictures seen through the holes in the book. Ask your child what it is, and what the scene on the next page might be.
- ❖ Talk about what farmers do. Talk about the jobs the animals in the book perform in real life, ex. cows are milked by farmers.
- ❖ Ask what other animals you might see on a farm.
- ❖ Talk about zoos and the animals you see there. Talk about the sounds those animals make, and where you might find them in the wild.
